"DISAPPOINTMENT"

Words of prophecy:

* If one is truly and entirely dependent upon My Word then they shall "never" be disappointed - for ALL disappointment has its root and source in a misplaced faith.

"disappointed" - depressed or discouraged by the failure of one's hopes or expectations;

...."just as it is written, "BEHOLD, I LAY IN ZION A STONE OF STUMBLING AND A ROCK OF OFFENSE, AND HE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM WILL NOT [could never] BE DISAPPOINTED".... Romans 9:33 NASB

The "feeling" of disappointment is rooted in condemnation and pride and is not of God. He is a God of Love and a God of patience [with all of His precious children]. Would one expect a mother to love her child less if they were not as diligent as they could be? Of course not. How much more then is the Father going to be patient with us - especially when we are found seeking Him with all of our heart?

...."and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out ["shed abroad" KJV] within our hearts through the Holy Spirit [Who is the Spirit of Love] who was given to us".... Romans 5:5 NASB
