WE ARE RECONCILED

* You have been reconciled to God through Jesus Christ. You have perfect fellowship now.

Oh, the wealth that belongs to you in this new relationship! Dare to act your part!

Ephesians 2:10, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus."

If you are His workmanship - you are satisfactory to Him.

He is pleased with you.

We have preached condemnation and sin so long, that we do not know how to preach Righteousness and tell the people what they are in Christ.
