How Spiritual Weakness Comes

* Spiritual weakness in the believer comes from the sense of his guilt, sin or unworthiness that continually confronts him. Whenever he attempts to pray, his unworthiness leaps into being and stands between him and the Father.

Faith loses its power, and the faculty through which believing functions becomes paralyzed. He can do nothing but stand passive and helpless in the presence of his sin-consciousness.

Now we know that God has put sin away. We know that we are New Creations created in Christ Jesus.

We know that God is the author of that New Creation, that what God has made clean we have no right to call unclean, and what God has justified we have no right to condemn.

We know another fact that we have been redeemed out of the hand of the enemy, translated out of the kingdom of darkness into the kingdom of the Son of His love, and that as redeemed men and women "There is therefore now no condemnation to us that are in Christ Jesus." We stand before the Father Redeemed, absolutely justified, or declared Righteous.

That declaration has come from the very throne of God.

If God has Justified us and declared us righteous, who has a right to

condemn us? Surely Jesus will not do it, because it was Jesus that died for us and now lives for us.
